March ???; Hagerstown and Frederick, Maryland, USA: The limited registration spots for the "Ride with a PRO" clinic featuring Trek/VW's Jeremiah Bishop at Maryland's Greenbrier Challenge are filling up fast. The clinic will be held on April 28, the day before the Greenbrier Challenge UCI and AMBC Mountain Bike races at the Greenbrier State Park located about halfway between the towns of Hagerstown and Frederick, Maryland.

The clinic will be run by team Trek/VW's off-road superstar Jeremiah Bishop, the defending Pan American Games Gold Medalist. Jeremiah also finished 8th at the World Championships in 2006, for the best World Championship placing of a U.S. rider in a decade. Jeremiah will conduct a short discussion on preparations for the race and have a question/answer period, before he and other Pros take riders for 1 or 2 pre-ride laps of the actual Greenbrier Challenge course. The Pros will stop and discuss how to negotiate various trail features and take questions all along the way.



Registrations for the *Greenbrier Challenge Ride with a PRO* will be limited to 60 riders with a small reserve. The clinic is free, but interested riders must pre-register via the on-line registration service BikeReg.com. Entry is on a first-come, first served basis.

The Greenbrier Challenge on April 29 will feature internationally-ranked professional mountain bikers competing for starting spots at the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games, as well as 49 divisions of amateur and semi-pro racers competing for AMBC and Maryland State Championships and an invitation to the United States National Championships. It is one of only eight internationally-ranked races in America in which riders can score points toward the Nations Rankings that determine how many riders each country may send to the Olympics. And, it is also one of the few opportunities for U.S. racers to score points on home soil in their quest to earn a spot on USA Cycling's Olympic Long Team, from which the actual Olympic team will be chosen.
